Pvt colleges to challenge move to scrap elementary edu course

Was discontinued in government colleges two years ago

ROHTAK, SEPTEMBER 13
Private colleges have warned the state government of moving the Punjab and Haryana High Court if Diploma in Elementary Education (DELED) course is discontinued, stating that it was against the fundamental right of citizens.

"The government can't snatch the fundamental right of education by discontinuing the DELED course. It will also render as many as 5,100 teaching and non-teaching staff of 342 private colleges jobless. So, we have decided to move the HC for relief," said Satish Khola, president, Haryana Self Finance Private College Association.

He said all private colleges had got the recognition from the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), a statutory body mandated to oversee standards, procedures

and processes in the education system, hence how could the government pave the way for the closure of the colleges by withdrawing the course.

"A meeting of all these colleges held in Rohtak on Sunday also decided to meet public representatives of the region, urging them to mount

pressure on the government not to discontinue the course as it will also force the local youth to pursue it from other states by bearing extra expenses," Khola added.

Education Minister Kanwar Pal Gurjar, while talking to *The Tribune* recently, had said the DELED course was not needed in the New Education Policy hence the government was seriously contemplating over its discontinuation. "Otherwise too, no recruitment of primary teacher has been made in the past eight years even when the state has such diploma holders in a surplus number," he added.

The colleges said the admission process for the course was generally started in July but this year, no such schedule had so far been released by the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT).

State has lowest active cases in North India

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 13

The state has recorded the lowest number of active Covid cases in the Northern India. According to the state Health Department figures till September 12, there were 187 active cases in the state — 5.8 cases per million population (Census 2011).

Haryana is followed by neighbouring Punjab, which had a total of 319 active cases till Sunday — 11.5 cases per million population. Delhi, Chandigarh and Uttarakhand recorded 24.5, 26.5 and 31.7 active cases per million population, respectively.

Four districts in Haryana — Sirsa, Palwal, Nuh and Mahendragarh — have no active case now. Charkhi Dabri, Fatehabad, Jind and Kurukshetra have just a case while Bhiwani and Jhajjar have two cases each.

More than one-third of the active cases of the state are in Gurugram (50).
"We have made vaccination

a mass movement in the state. For the first dose, 1.40 crore people have been covered while for the second dose, around 44 lakh residents have been covered," said Dr Veena Singh, Director General Health Services, Haryana.
Meanwhile, the week ending on September 12 recorded just three deaths. It has been the lowest since the week of February 15-21, which too had recorded three deaths. So far, 9,686 people have succumbed to the virus. On the vaccination front, the state has administered 1.83 crore doses till September 12.

74,978 appear for HCS exam

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 13

A total of 74,978 candidates appeared for the Haryana Civil Service (Executive Branch) and other Allied Services Preliminary Examination 2021 conducted by the Haryana Public Service Commission (HPSC) on September 12 in two sessions.

535 centres set up in 13 districts

Giving information in this regard, an official spokesperson said the Commission had advertised 155 vacancies in March, for which a total of 1,48,262 candidates had applied. He added that the highest number of applications was received this year. A total of 535 centres were established in 13 districts — Ambala, Faridabad, Gurugram, Hisar, Kaithal, Karnal, Kurukshetra, Panchkula, Panipat, Rewari, Sirsa, Sonapat and Yamunanagar.

The Commission had made elaborate arrangements for the smooth and fair conduct of the examinations, the official added. —TNS

HC: Can't challenge nature and extent of reservation on grounds of discrimination

Clarifying the legal position on quota, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has ruled that the nature and extent of reservation cannot be challenged on the grounds of discrimination with reference to other reserved categories. There could not be equality in the matters of reservation.

Expressing anguish at the quality of pleadings in constitutional matters such as reservation, the Bench of Justice Jaswant Singh and Justice Meenakshi I Mehta added that writ petitions challenging the rules, instructions or circulars issued by the state government providing reservation were being challenged on the grounds of violation of constitutional provisions in a very casual manner. The Bench was hearing a petition by Balwan Singh and another general category ex-

WHAT THE BENCH SAID

- Reservation for ex-servicemen is a special as contemplated under Article 16(1) of the Constitution. Being horizontal, it is reservation within reservation.
- Discrimination is inherent in the very concept of reservation. It permits differential treatment of unequal.
- The Constitution empowers the State to identify backward classes of citizens, or other disadvantaged or weaker sections of society requiring preferential treatment for their socio-economic advancement.
- Reservation is a mechanism under the Constitution to ensure equality and not to claim privileges or benefits over and above or on a par with the other oppressed classes



serviceman, who had applied for the post of Civil Judge (Junior Division) in Haryana Civil Services (Judicial Branch) advertised by the Haryana Public Service Commission, vide advertisement dated January 13.

Among other things, the Bench was told that "by converting 5 per cent reservation for ex-servicemen in direct recruitment in group A & B category from vertical to horizontal, the state government has wrongly granted the benefit of reservation within reservation or double benefit to the reserved category employees".

Rejecting the argument, the Bench asserted that it was not only contrary to the very nature and concept of horizontal reservation, but was also inherently fallacious. "The intent of reserva-

No more 84-day dose gap for medical travel

The Haryana Government has reduced the mandatory 84-day gap between the two doses of Covishield for two more categories of travellers.

The Director of the National Health Mission (NHM) today ordered the Civil Surgeons to extend the relaxation to those availing of treatment for any health problems abroad and foreign nationals wishing to return to their countries.

"The relaxation will also be allowed in circumstances where foreign travel may be unavoidable and the mandatory 84-day gap after the first dose of vaccination has not elapsed," the order of the NHM managing director said. However, the individual concerned will be asked to produce a copy of the travel documents such as visa or confirmed tickets, besides other documents justifying the urgency of the foreign visit.

Couple die by suicide

SONEPAT, SEPTEMBER 13

A 45-year-old man and his wife died by suicide by jumping before a train near Jahri railway crossing on Sunday. Their 12-year-old son died in the incident too while trying to save his parents.

The deceased have been identified as Gadiram, his wife Sunita and their 12-year-old son Shubham, residents of West Ram Nagar locality. The family is survived by the couple's 15-year-old daughter Pinki.

According to the police, the family had reached the railway crossing to talk but Gadiram noticed a train on the tracks and ran towards the tracks to end his life. Sunita chased after her husband to stop him. Their son followed his mother. People gathered at the spot after hearing Pinki's cries and called the police. —TNS

Court stays framing of charge against realty firm

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 13

Just over a month after Panchkula Special Judge held that the supply of documents not relied upon could not be demanded by the accused, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has stayed the framing of charge against Commander Realtors Private Limited. Gurugram. The order will remain in force at least till October 6, when the case comes up for resumed hearing. The High Court has already put the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on notice.

The Bench was hearing a petition filed against the premier investigating agency by Commander Realtors Private Limited, Gurugram, through senior advocate RS Rai with the investigating agency filed supplementary challan. Rai submitted that the documents, statements and seized recorded would be necessary for addressing arguments when charge was to be framed. —TNS
